## EDITORS NOTE

Mr. W. L. Kinkead has sent us the following article covering material not included in his catalog of USA Maps in the Poster Stamp Bulletin. Mr. Kinkead has been untiring in his efforts to catalog this interesting material.

# POSTER MAPS BY W. L. KINKEAD

A number of sets of Posters showing Maps exist that may be of interest to Collectors of Map-Posters, namely "POSTACO" this series, so far as the writer knows shows maps of 36 of our 48 states in black on blue, on green and on yellow, size 41x56mm. or 56x41mm, 3 sets of 36 each, of these the green seems to be the scarcer.

Another set of map posters was issued some years ago by a French concern Authur Maury these are black zinc line cuts, reproduced from originals mounted side by side and photographed, this accounts for the differ ences in size of type of Titles. Four sheets of these stamps are known, Sheet 1/1 is composed of 119 stamps, bearing names of countries in alphabetical order from Abyssinia to Crete, Sheet #2 Cuba to Madagascar, 117 stamps, Sheet #3 Maderia to Saint Vincent 117 stamps, and sheet #4 Salomon (Iles) to Zululand, 88 stamps or 441 stamps in all. On the bottom of Sheet #1 is an imprint reading PARIS - Imp. Paul 4508 Dupont (Cl.) - 98.4.1946. 3 different sizes of type occur throughout the sheets.

Still another lot of Philatelic Maps are those being issued by Mr. K. Bileski, Station B, winnipeg, Canada. These maps are  $3x4\frac{1}{2}$ " in size with scales that vary from 30 to 600 miles per inch, are being printed in from four to seven colors and make a very attractive map to place in stamp collections; so far I understand about 900 different have been printed, but I have not seen them all.

A fourth lot of map posters, are the Selfridge "Miniature Maps" comprising sixty in number, showing British Colonies. These also make nice headings for stamp collectors, they are  $2\frac{1}{2}\times 2\frac{1}{2}$ " over all and are gummed and all are printed in blue, black on white and did cost about  $2\not\in$  each.

All four of these sets are in addition to the large number of Poster-Map Stamps that are now being cataloged in the Poster Stamp Bulletin. These are being listed under 118 headings, covering the United States as a map, the States, the Hemispheres, and Foreign Countries, the Jorld, Globes without Maps, Celestial Maps, and Posters that show lines that indicate maps, but not clearly defined. These will number close to 3000, and if one were to add the Postage Stamps, State Revenues, Meters, etc. as listed not long ago in "Gossip" a collector would have a wonderful showing of most interesting "Miniature Maps".
